Errazuriz Sauvignon Blanc 2016, Aconcagua, Chile

Errazuriz has been recognized within the past few years as the single top quality producer of Chilean wines, with critical acclaim and top ratings from the Wine Spectator, the Wine Advocate and Tanzer. Fine aromas influenced by the Pacific Ocean of lemon grass, scallion and lime. Minerally and juicy with a lean finish.

Paul Hobbs “La Flor” Malbec Rosé, Mendoza, Argentina

The young vines of Pulenta Estate yield rich, lively wines with an emphasis on bright fruit expression. Bottled early for softer tannin structure and earlier enjoyment. Paul Hobbs produces some of our favorite wines from vineyards in several countries.

Llama Old Vine Malbec 2016, Mendoza, Argentina

This black Bordeaux grape, which thrives in Argentina, is produced from 100 year old vines. Great intensity and aromas of cherries and plum. Fine toasty hints from ageing in top-quality oak.

Vina Cobos “Felino” Malbec 2013, Mendoza, Argentina

Another project of Paul Hobbs who undertook the challenge of producing great Argentine red wine on par with the best-known wines in the world. His previous work was with Robert Mondavi as a wine maker of Opus One. Felino offers a good fruit-forward expression and adequate oak for a subtle, harmonious finish.

Secreto de Viu Manent Carmenere 2014, Colchagua, Chile

Environmentally conscientious, Viu Manet winery is Certified Carbon Neutral, with a particular focus on sustainability, energy efficiency and climate change. Fresh plums and red cherries intermingle with black pepper and fresh-ground coffee.

Bodega Garzon Tannat 2013, Uruguay

The grape variety *Tannat*, the symbol of Uruguayan wine, has allowed Uruguay to achieve international fame on note of the grape’s unique velvety flavor. In Uruguay, the production of Tannat is richer in aromas and flavors than that of its native region in southeast France, and in fact, the grape shows local particularities of Uruguay, rendering it unlike any other wine.
